


Early intervention and successful remediation for struggling readers starts at the beginning with the building blocks. Reading, spelling, and writing are all higher-level language skills. What science has shown us for decades is that the building blocks of language always start with SOUNDS.

Understanding The Science

When you first learned to ride a bicycle, your brain had to accept and coordinate your balance, center of gravity, left/right sequence, speed, direction, and position in space. It didn't all happen on your first try.

- After several (or maybe many) attempts, the recruited brain cells (neurons) started communicating with each other by firing electrical signals.
- The more attempts, the better the brain connections, and eventually, those neurons "learned" what to do.

A Struggling Child

A young man (we'll call him Brian) was struggling to pass the ninth grade. Feeling like a failure, he was drowning in a sea of illiteracy, unable to complete his daily scholastic tasks. Discouraged and depressed, his weaknesses were academically and socially crippling. His parents were desperate to find help; they knew their son had a bright, unlimited future if he could just get past the learning struggles. Brian was having difficulty with reading, math, and written expression due to a language disorder, visual processing deficits, dyslexia, and ADHD.

The Impact

Brian began an intensive 16-week program and worked hard every day, determined to overcome his challenges. When starting his program, he had multiple areas of weakness including the inability to sound out words, to read, to write, to understand directions well, to process information visually, and to express himself verbally. All of these deficits were below the 16th percentile for age-matched peers.

After completing the program, testing showed tremendous progress; Brian reached the 50th percentile in multiple areas in just a few short months. He returned to his high school a different student. He is now making A's and B's, playing sports, and thriving socially and academically. He is confident now, believing that the future he wanted is achievable
